THE SPEAKERS

KEYNOTES:

We are particularly proud to present keynote speakers who are pioneers and innovators in their respective fields of research & patient care:

Prof. Bruce Levine (ISCT President-Elect, *University of Pennsylvania, USA*)

Prof. Fiona WOOD (*Royal Perth Hospital, Australia*)

Prof. Bruce LEVINE, Barbara and Edward Netter Professor in Cancer Gene Therapy, is the Founding Director of the Clinical Cell and Vaccine Production Facility (CVPF) in the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine and the Abramson Cancer Center, Perelman School of Medicine, University of Pennsylvania. He received a B.A. (Biology) from Penn and a Ph.D. in Immunology and Infectious Diseases from Johns Hopkins. First-in-human adoptive immunotherapy trials include the first use of a lentiviral vector, the first infusions of gene edited cells, and the first use of lentivirally-modified cells to treat cancer. Dr. Levine has overseen the production, testing and release of 3,000 cellular products administered to >1,200 patients in clinical trials since 1996. He is co-inventor of the first FDA approved gene therapy (Kymriah), chimeric antigen receptor T cells for leukemia and lymphoma, licensed to Novartis. Dr. Levine is co-inventor on 26 issued US patents and co-author of >160 manuscripts and book chapters with a Google Scholar citation h-index of 80. He is a Co-Founder of Tmunity Therapeutics, a spin-out of the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Levine is President Elect of the International Society for Cell and Gene Therapy and serves on the Board of Directors of the Alliance for Regenerative Medicine. He has been interviewed by the NY Times, Wall Street Journal, Washington Post, NPR, Time Magazine, National Geographic, Bloomberg, Forbes, BBC, and other international media outlets. Prof Fiona WOOD has been a burns surgeon and researcher for the past 20 years and is Director of the Burns Service of Western Australia (BSWA). She is a Consultant Plastic Surgeon at Fiona Stanley Hospital (previously at Royal Perth Hospital) and Princess Margaret Hospital for Children, co-founder of the first skin cell laboratory in WA, Winthrop Professor in the School of Surgery at The University of Western Australia, and co-founder of the Fiona Wood Foundation (formerly The McComb Foundation). Professor Wood's greatest contribution and enduring legacy is her work pioneering the innovative 'spray-on skin' technique (Recell), which

greatly reduces permanent scarring in burns victims. Professor Wood patented her method in 1993 and today the technique is used worldwide. Fiona was named a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in 2003. In 2005 she won the Western Australia Citizen of the Year award for her contribution to Medicine in the field of burns research. That same year her contribution to burns care was recognised through Australia's highest accolade when she was named Australian of the Year for 2005. She is an Australian Living Treasure, and voted the most-trusted Australian in a Reader's Digest poll for six successive years from 2005 to 2010. [Publication list](#)



Terms & Conditions

- I. APPLICATION FOR SPACE: Application for exhibit space shall be made in writing on the application form provided in the Exhibit Space Order Form.
- II. SPACE ASSIGNMENT: SCSS will attempt to honor all requests for exhibit location and space. SCSS reserves the right to change location assignments at any time.
- III. PAYMENT: Full payment is required to secure the preferred booth. If payment is not received within 3 weeks of the invoice date, the reserved booth will be released to the pool of unsold booths.
- IV. CANCELLATION: SCSS must be notified in writing in the event of cancellation or change of sponsorship type. If cancellation of sponsorship is made prior to Sept 13, 2019, the exhibitor may be refunded 50% of the payment received. After Sept 13, 2019 no refunds will be made.
- V. FLOOR PLAN: All dimensions and locations shown on the floor plan are believed to be accurate. SCSS reserves the right to make modifications as may be necessary to meet the needs of the exhibitors and the exhibit program.
- VI. CANCELLATION OF MEETING AND EXHIBITION: If SCSS should be prevented from holding the Exhibition by reason of any cause beyond its control (such as, but not limited to damage to buildings, riots, labor disputes, acts of government or acts of God) or if it cannot permit the exhibitor to occupy the space due to causes beyond its control, then SCSS has the right to cancel the Exhibition with no further liability to the exhibitor other than a refund of space rental less a proportionate share of Exhibition expenses.
- VII. RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF SPACE: No exhibitor shall sublet, assign, or share any part of the space allocated without the written consent of SCSS. Solicitations or demonstrations by exhibitors must be confined within the bounds of their assigned space.
